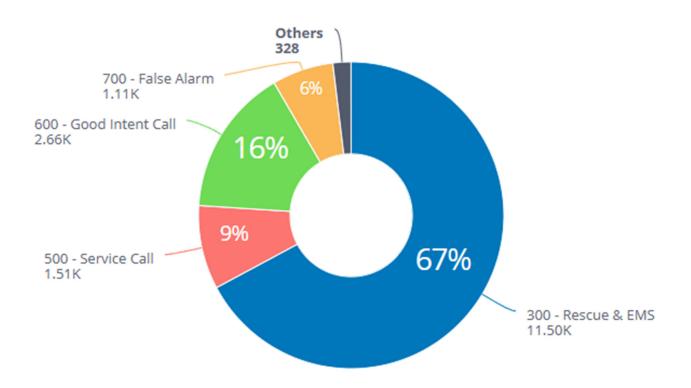

EMS REPORT

FY 25' Capitol Items

- Rescues: We ended up only able to acquire one rescue for FY25. The rescue is coming from Horton. The resolution passed commission and we have PO 351123 for \$530,874.
- Lifepak 15: We normally replace two lifepaks per year. This year we did not purchase a LP15 because of a possible lease to own agreement, involving LP35's which we are pushing off until 2026 or 2027
- Lucas: We have been replacing two of these devices per year. This device performs mechanical CPR and is critical to cardiac arrest patients during transport. We have already placed our order to Physio for two Lucas for FY 25 and have PO 350553, type P, dated 12/05/2024.
- We had a stair chair in the Capitol replacement budget but we did not purchase the stair chair because we are now purchasing the stair chairs with each new rescue vehicle.
- We purchased 5 new Tough books and have received them. The new Tough books are currently at IT being formatted. The new Tough books will go on the rescue trucks in an effort to keep the Tough books working flawlessly.



• Decision was made to replace rescue 31466, which was involved in an accident. The money is supposed to come out of FY'25 budget.

FY 26' Capital Items

- We are placing one rescue in the replacement. This rescue could have a 36 month build time.
- We are not putting any LP in for replacement. We are looking at a lease to own program for FY
 27 where we would get 8 LP35's all at once and be able to pay for them over 5-8 years.
- We are placing one Lucas in for replacement. The Lucas stock seems to be in good shape and we can try going to replacing one Lucas per year moving forward.
- We are putting in to replace 7 Tough books. These Tough books are how we bill for EMS transports, it is important to keep them working flawlessly. The plan is to replace the rescue tough books every three years. We will look at purchasing 7 Tough Books for two consecutive years and then not buying any for one or two years.
- We are still waiting to take delivery of two Road Rescue vehicles that were from FY23'. These are the first two vehicles from this brand. We already have PO 340710 Type P, dated 12/13/2023 and expect the delivery date to be 2/2026.

FIRE OPERATIONS REPORT

FY 25' Capital Items

- New Platform Aerial Truck: In-service at station 61.
- New PUC Engine: In-service at station 63.
- Battery Powered Extrication Equipment: Continued the replacement of the old-style gas-powered
 equipment on each frontline suppression apparatus. Battery Extrication equipment allows for faster
 deployment and easier maneuverability during rescue situations.
- Multi-gas Meters: New gas meters have been ordered and awaiting delivery. These gas meters are
 used to monitor air quality after fires and during hazardous material incidents.
- Spare Hose: Supply and Attack hose has been ordered to replace hose damaged during incidents or that failed inspection. Additionally, red supply hose was added to all suppression units as a safety indicator.

FY 26' Capital Items

- We have one Engine for replacement in FY 26, expected build time is 36-40 months.
- We will continue the replacement plan of extrication equipment.
- We will continue the replacement plan of spare hose.
