The City of Pompano Beach continued to provide vital support services to low- to moderate-income residents and individuals experiencing or at risk of homelessness through a coordinated network of local partners and service providers. These services included housing counseling, rental and utility assistance, and referrals to emergency shelters and transitional housing programs. Case management and supportive services were also offered to help individuals navigate access to healthcare, employment resources, and permanent housing solutions. By leveraging SHIP funding and collaborating with community-based organizations, the city worked to promote housing stability and reduce barriers to self-sufficiency among its most vulnerable populations.

Other Accomplishments

The City of Pompano Beach collaborated with internal and external parties to provide eligible community service activities. Public services dollars were expended on a wide array program though our subrecipients to serve some of the City's most vulnerable populations (elderly, disabled, homeless/at risk of homelessness, victims of domestic violence, at risk youth, etc. The city has also partnered with the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit Court and other agencies to establish Florida's second Community Court, which addresses low-level misdemeanor crimes and municipal ordinance violations. The court engages the community and assists individuals in need of social services. From July 1, 2024, to June 1, 2025, the Pompano Beach Community Court at the Annie L. Weaver Center reported:

- 73 Notices to Appear served
- · 90 community service hours completed
- · 23 participants graduated
- 97 walk-ins served
- 15 Permanent Supportive Housing Placements

Provide a description of efforts to reduce homelessness:

From July 2024 to June 2025, the Office of Housing & Urban Improvement allocated CDBG Public Services funds to support the following non-profit organizations in addressing the city's rising homelessness issue:

- 1. Covenant House Florida: Provided overnight emergency shelter to 18 homeless young adults aged 18-22.
- 2. Second Chance Society: Assisted 54 homeless individuals with services to help them re-enter the workforce.
- 3. Broward Partnership for the Homeless: Supported 687 Pompano Beach homeless residents with food and overnight shelter at the North Homeless Assistance Center located at 1700 Blount Rd., Pompano Beach.
- 4. Women In Distress of Broward County: Offered emergency shelter and therapy to 360 Pompano Beach residents who were victims of domestic violence.
- 5. The City of Pompano Beach's Housing and Social Services department provided homeless services to 36 Pompano Beach residents. The Housing and Social Services department provides holistic support to those in need. From addressing basic needs such as emergency shelter, food assistance, Identification card, birth certificates, social security cards and security deposits to providing comprehensive case management and access to housing resources, our program strives to empower individuals to overcome their current challenges and achieve stability. Through a personalized and individualized approach, our program ensures that each person receives the specific support and resources necessary to improve their situation and move towards self-sufficiency. By collaborating with other community organizations and service providers, Housing and Social Services program embodies a commitment to providing comprehensive care and assistance to those facing homelessness, making a positive impact on the lives of the individuals it serves.
